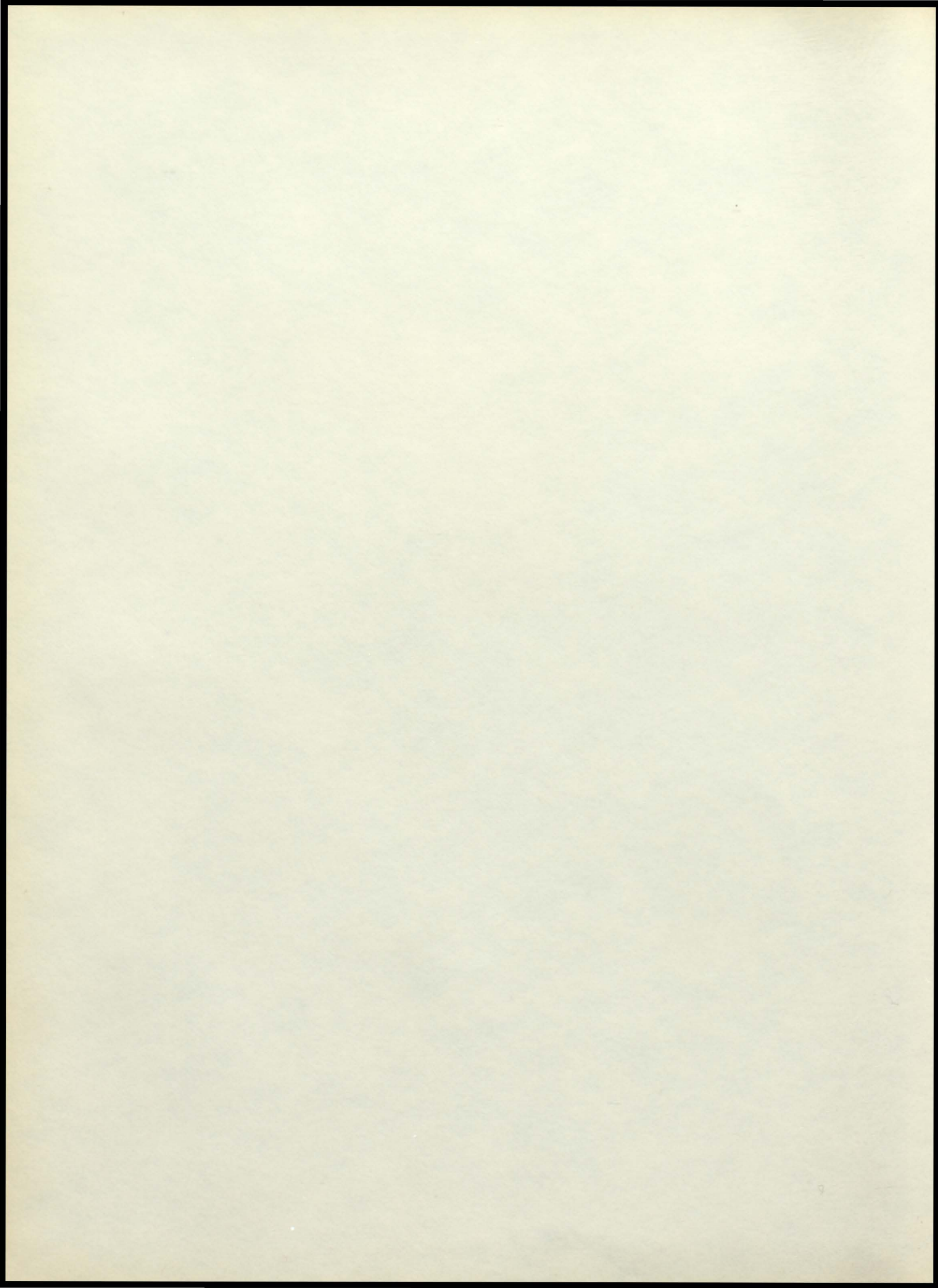


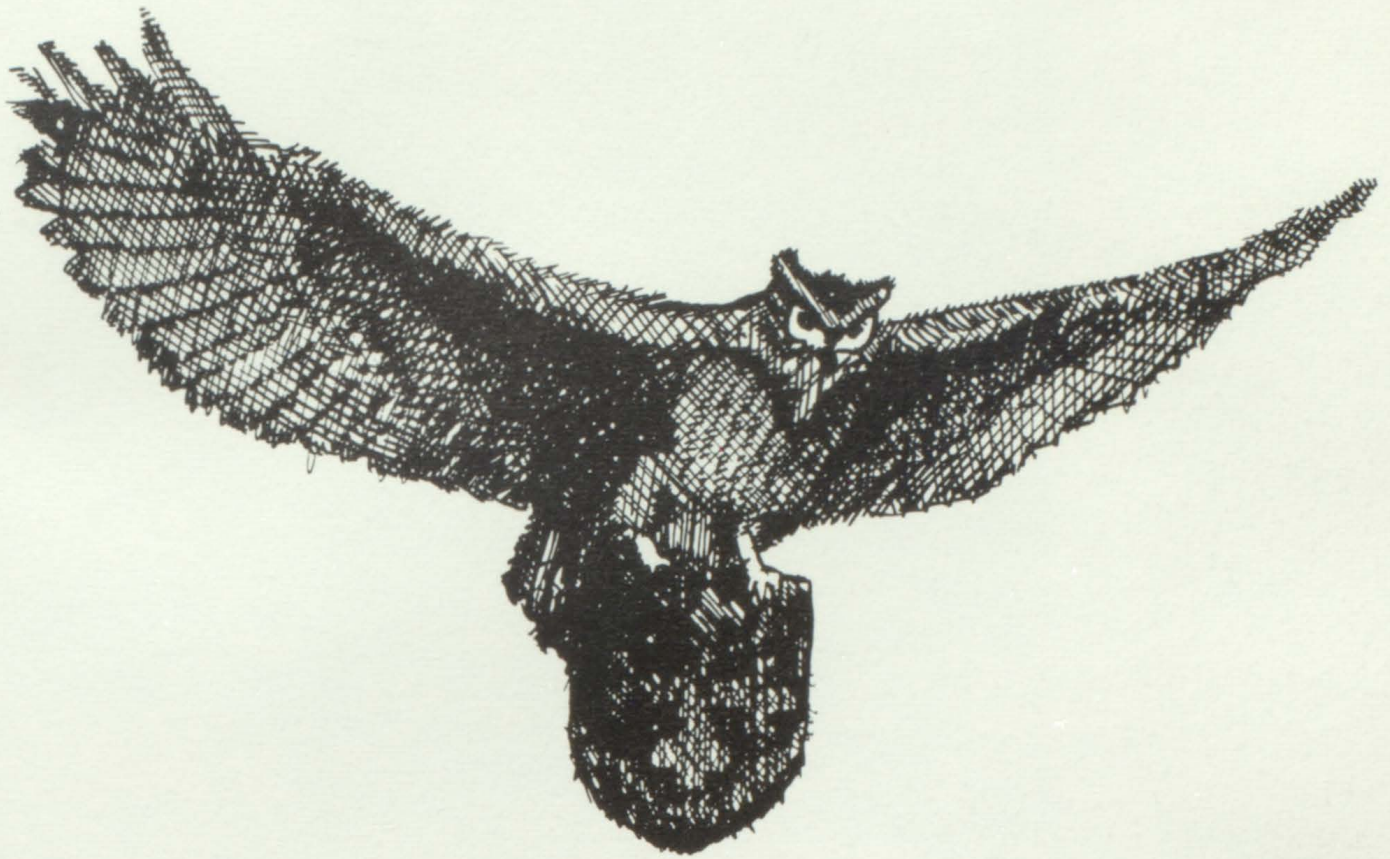

## Dedication

The 1980 Owl is dedicated to the dean of the faculty, *Mr. John F. Gane*. Mr. Gane has served Hoosac as a trustee, architect, craftsman, teacher, librarian and above all, example.

A prominent Philadelphia architect before coming to Hoosac, Mr. Gane is vice-president of the prestigious Carpenters' Company and former editor of the American Architects' Directory. In the 1950's, he led the revitalization of Philadelphia's historic Society Hill near Independence Hall, a project which became a model for the rest of the nation. The City again called on his talents in the 1960's to direct the Architects' Workshop, which restored homes, created playgrounds and beautified neighborhoods.

Mr. Gane came to Hoosac in 1972 at the request of his old friend and college roommate, George Levino. Under the direction of Mr. Gane, the old carriage house was turned into what is today the school library and Wood Hall.

Much to his surprise, and our pleasure, he stayed on at Hoosac School, filling any capacity in which he was needed. This year, he plans to return to Philadelphia to enjoy his long-delayed retirement. His dedication, high intelligence and unimpeachable manners will serve us long after both he, and we, have left Hoosac.

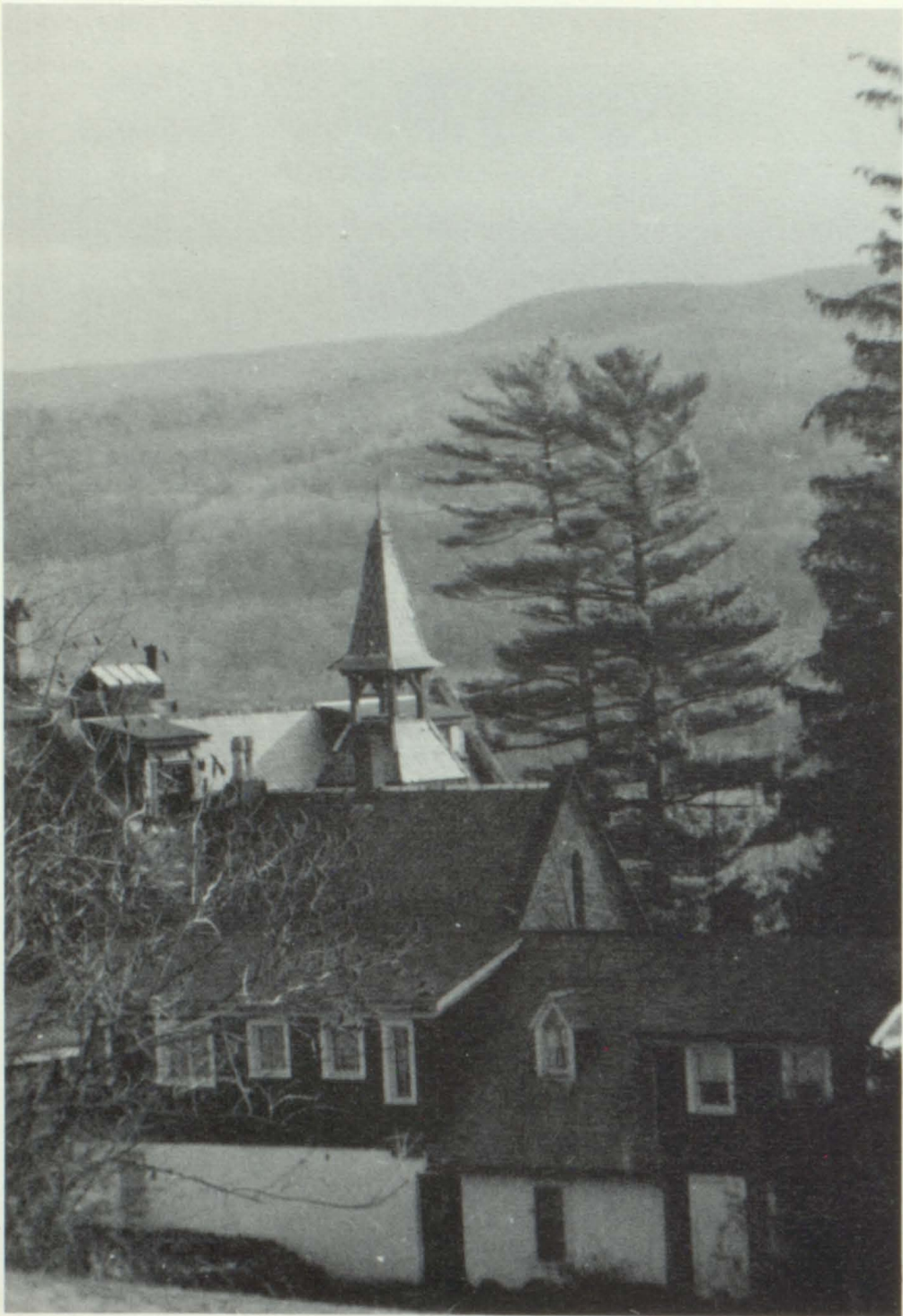
LETTER FROM THE HEADMASTER -

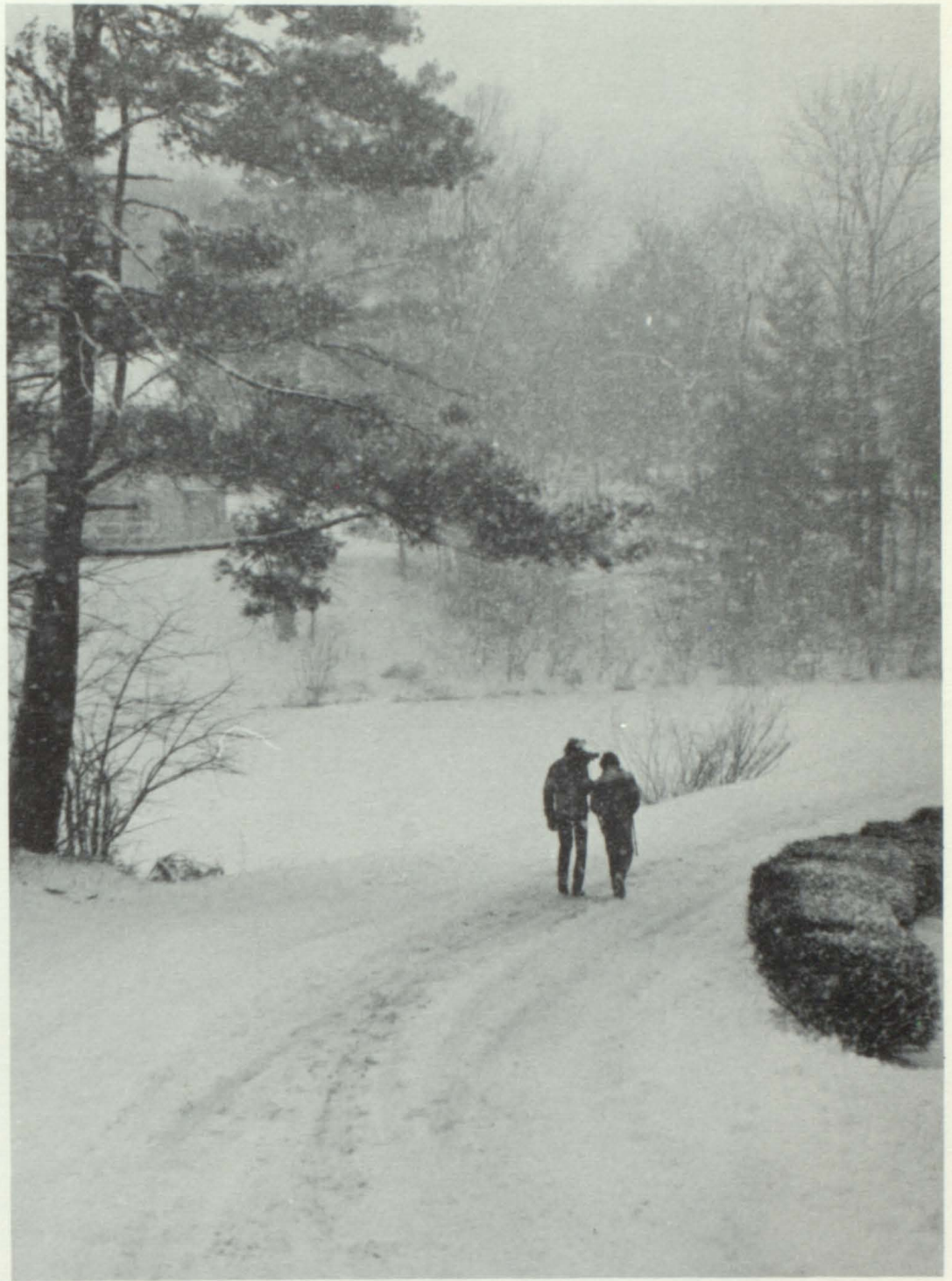

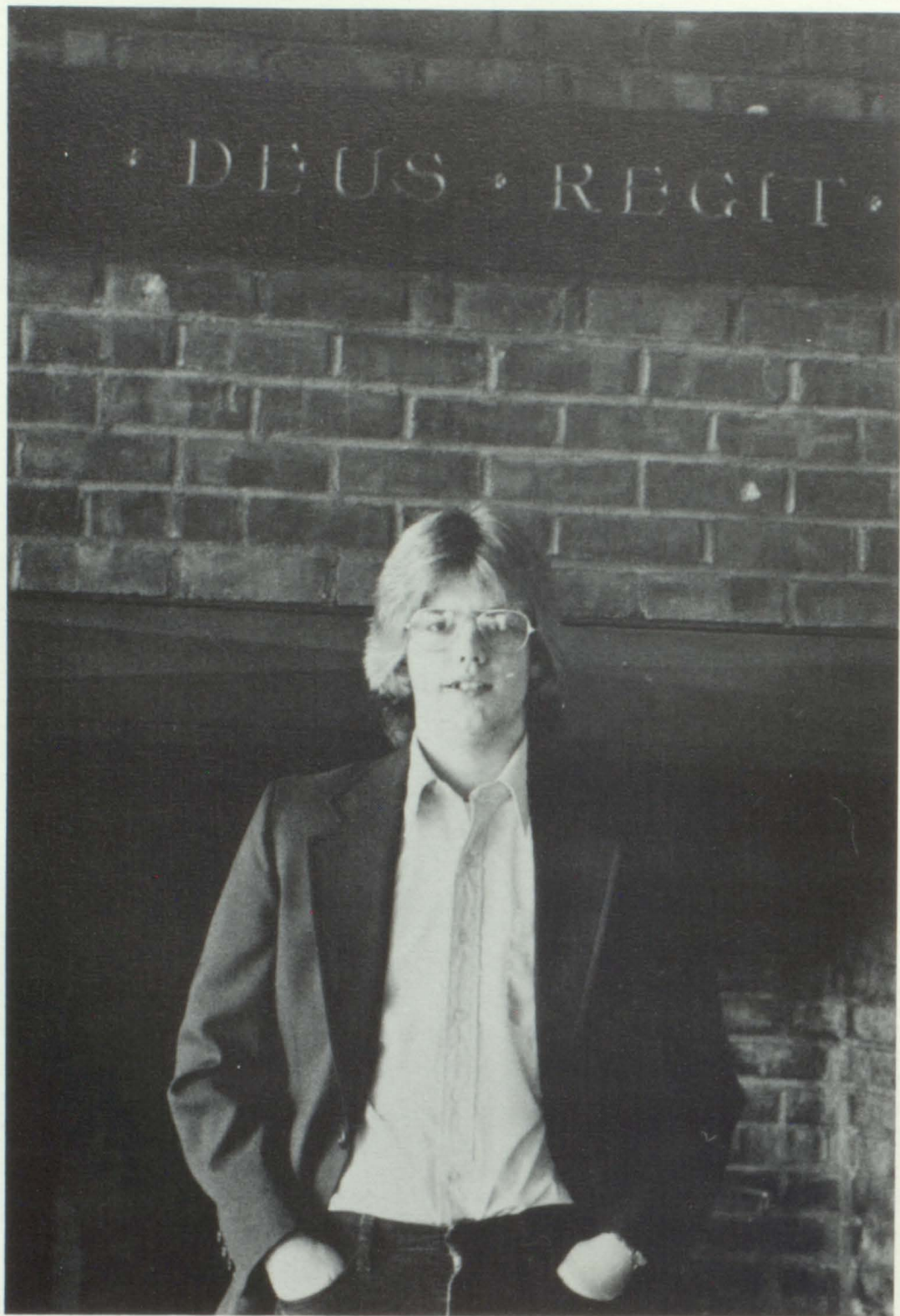

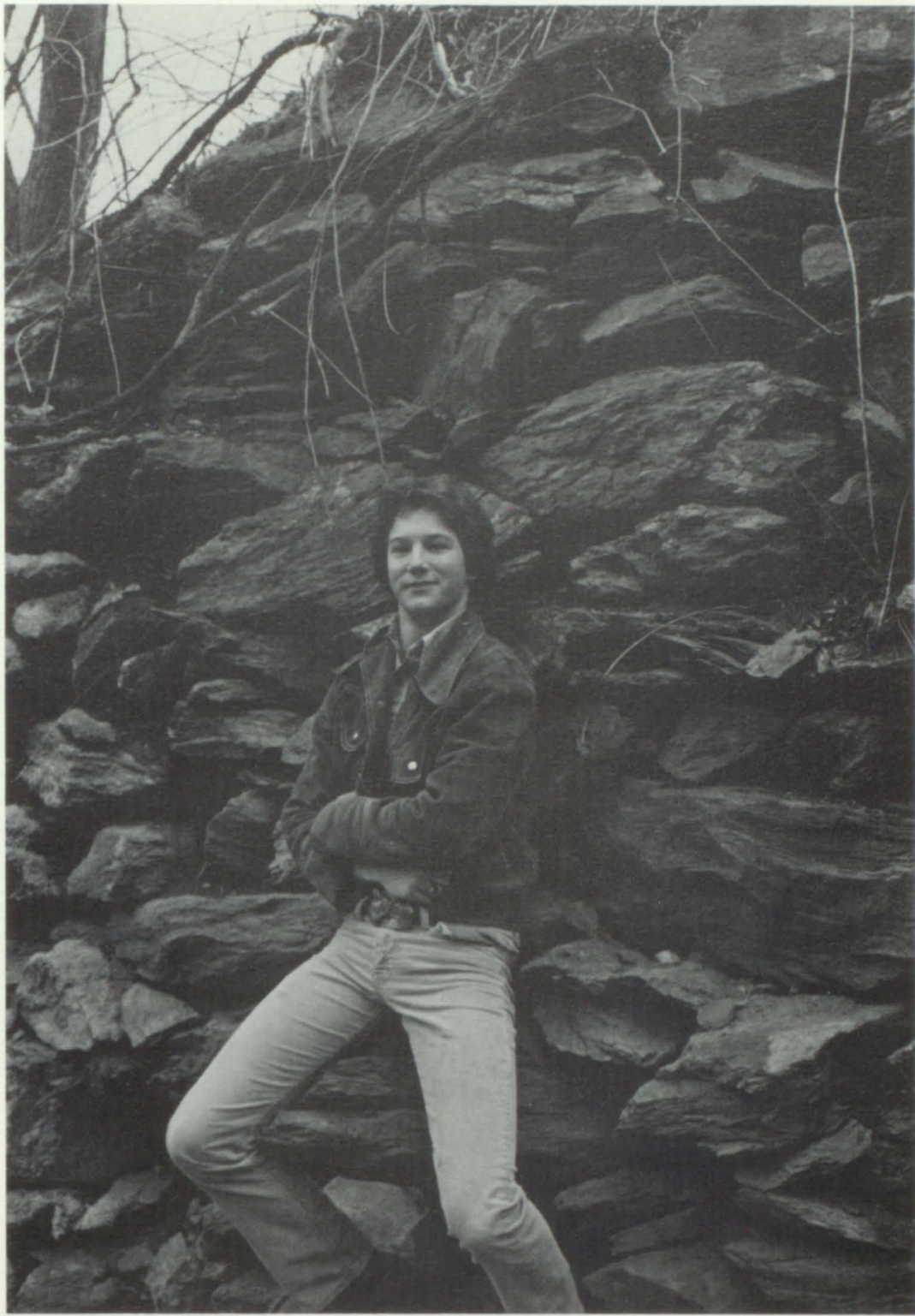

## Steve Montgomery

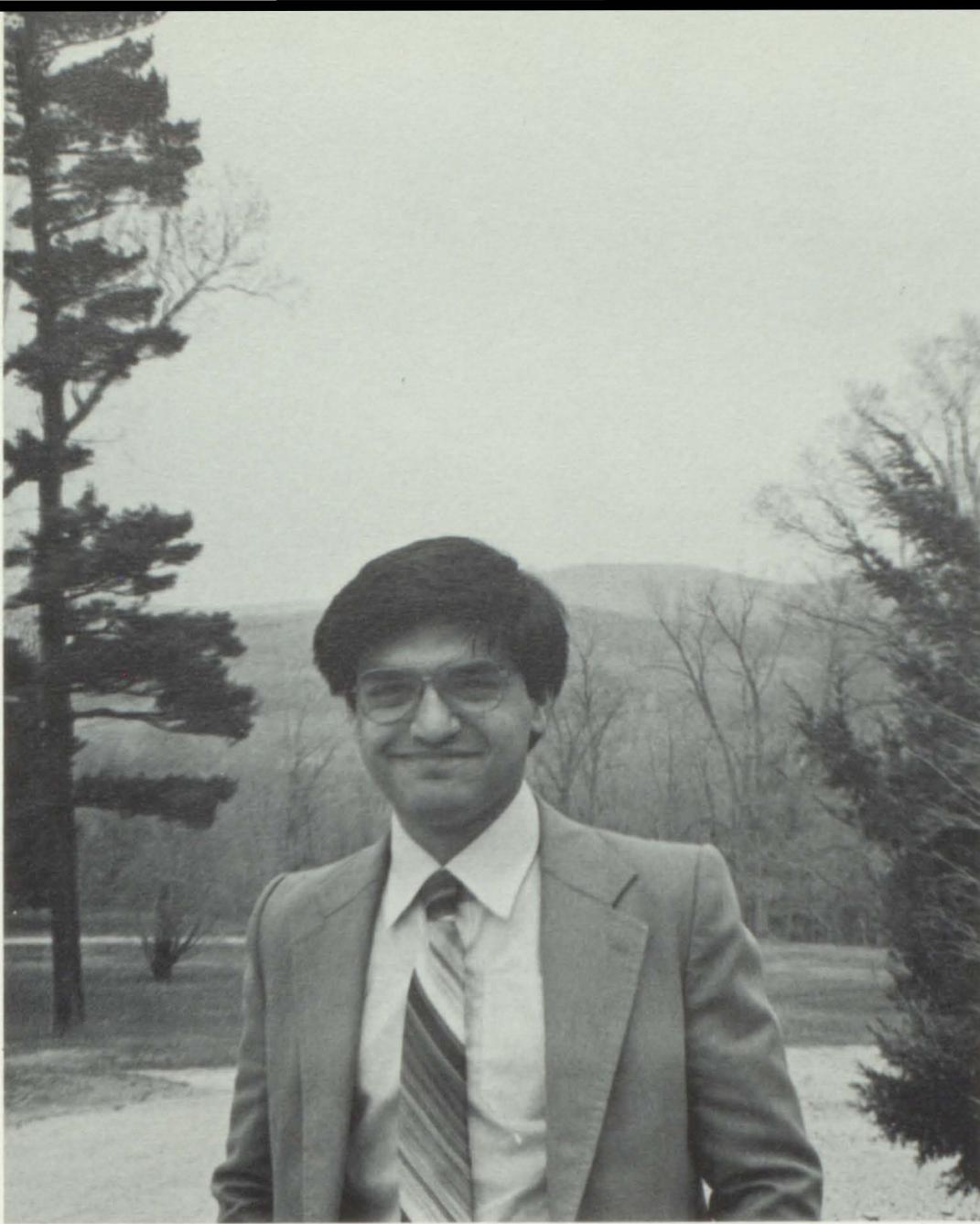

At Hoosac, Steve was a member of the Vestry, played hockey and pitched baseball. His ambition is to become a sports statistician.



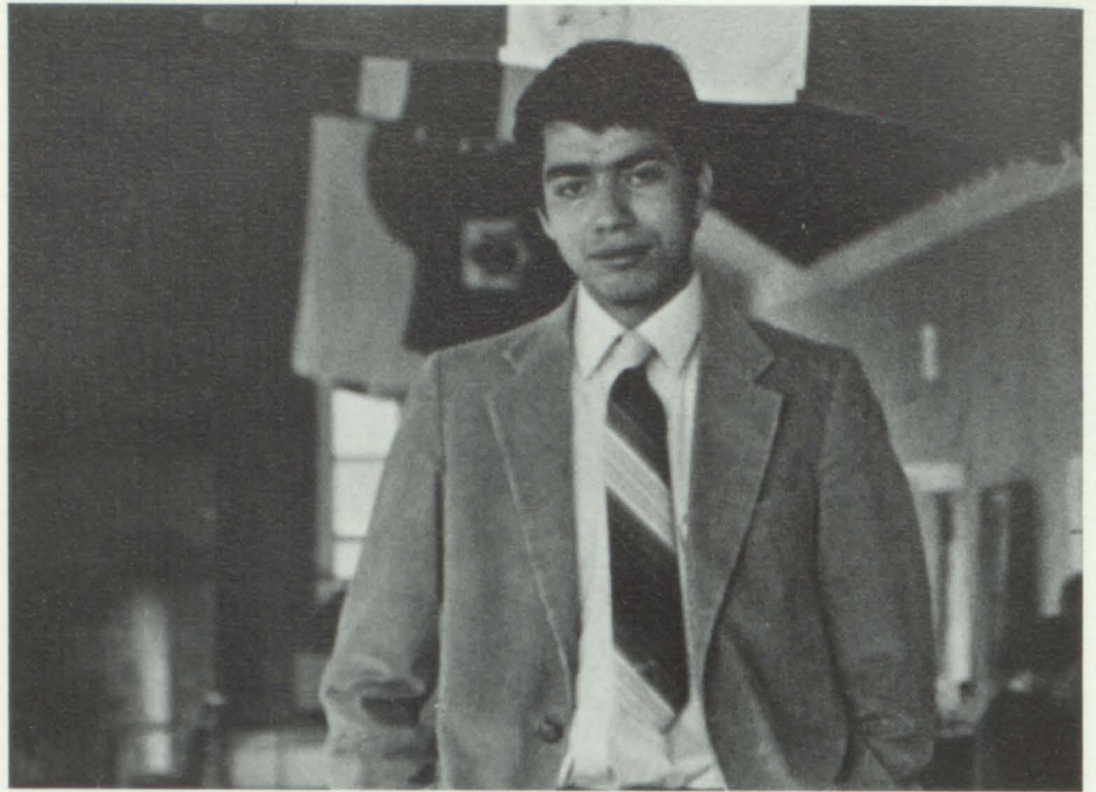
## Afcı Okhovat

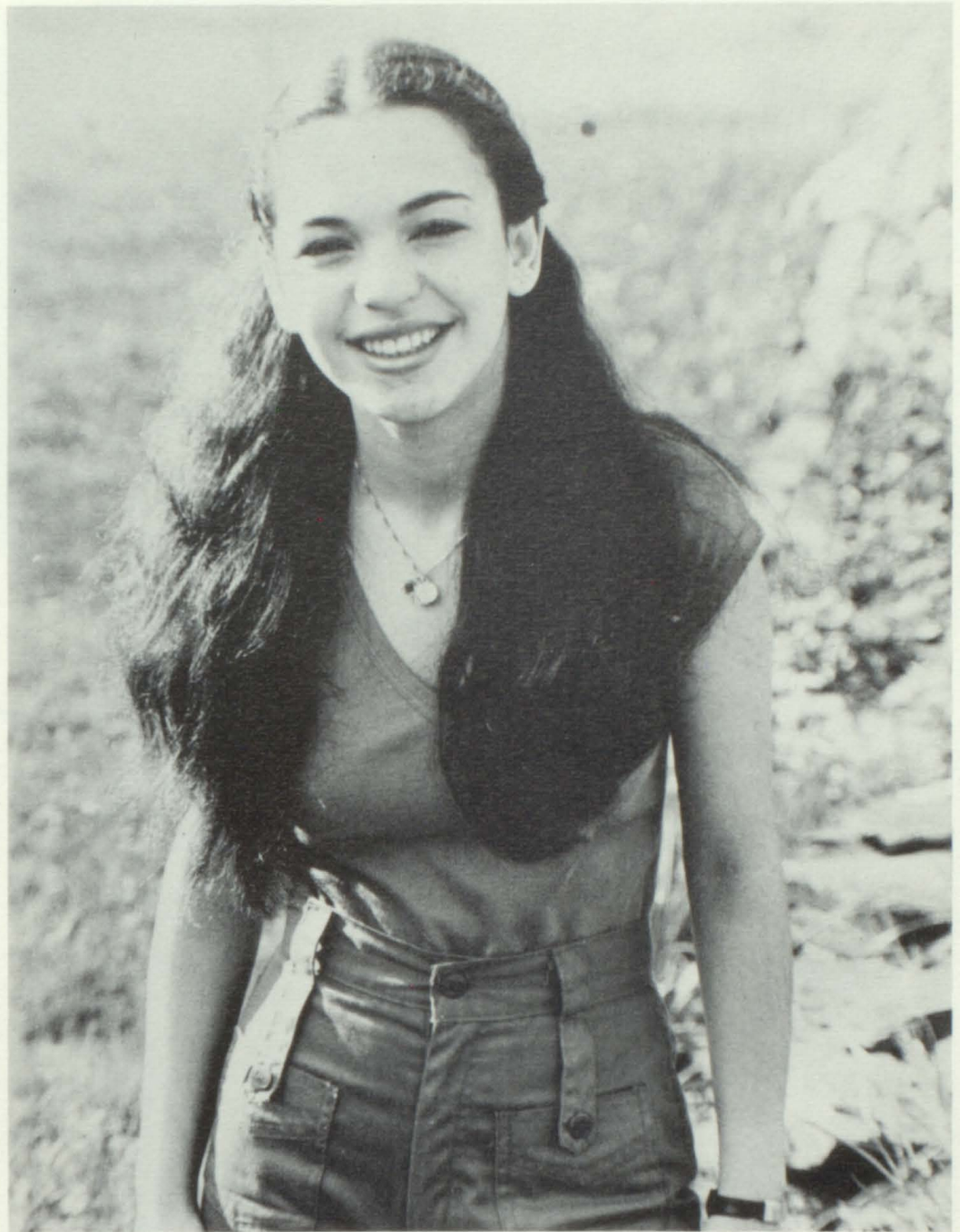


## Carlos Sahr

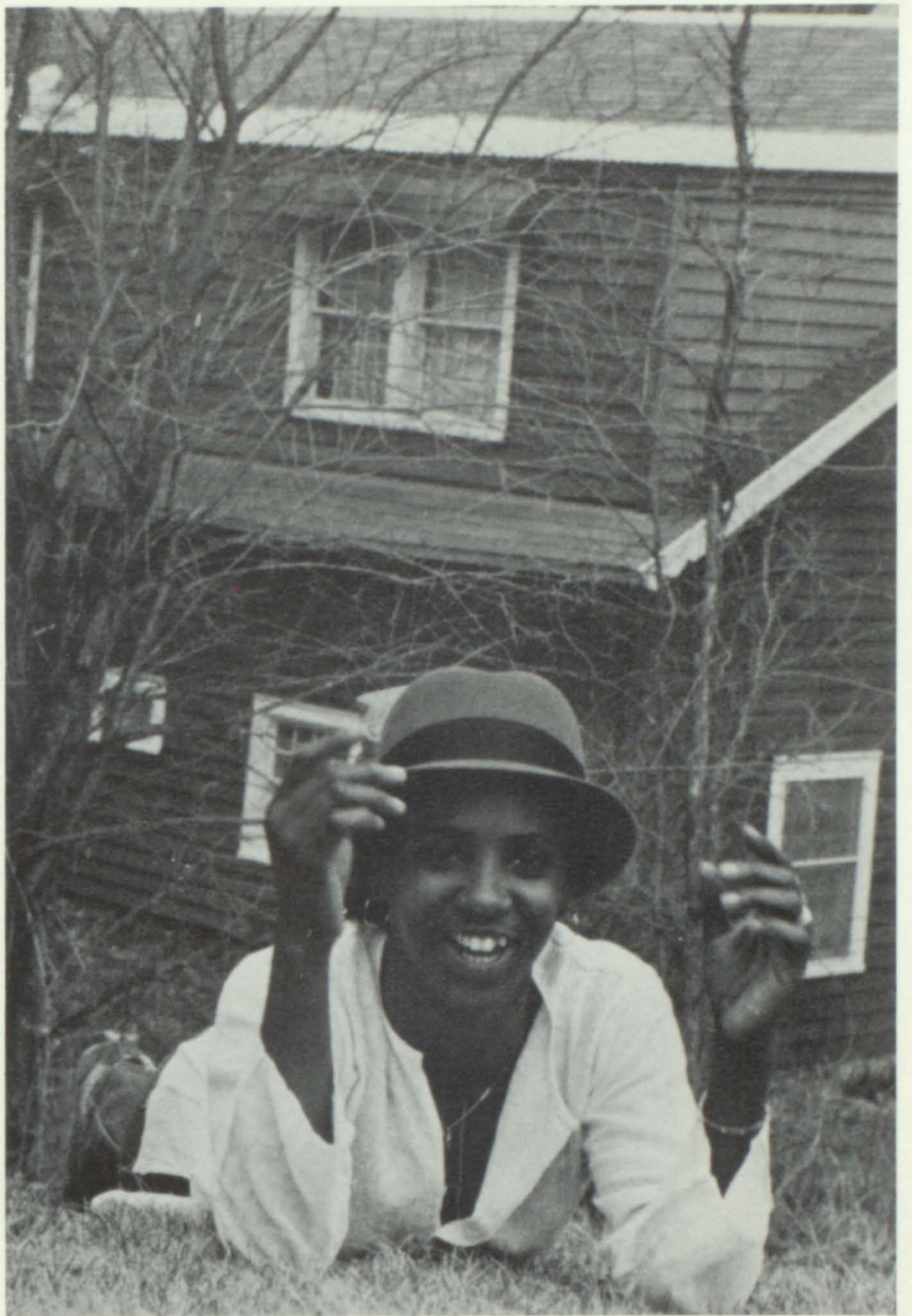

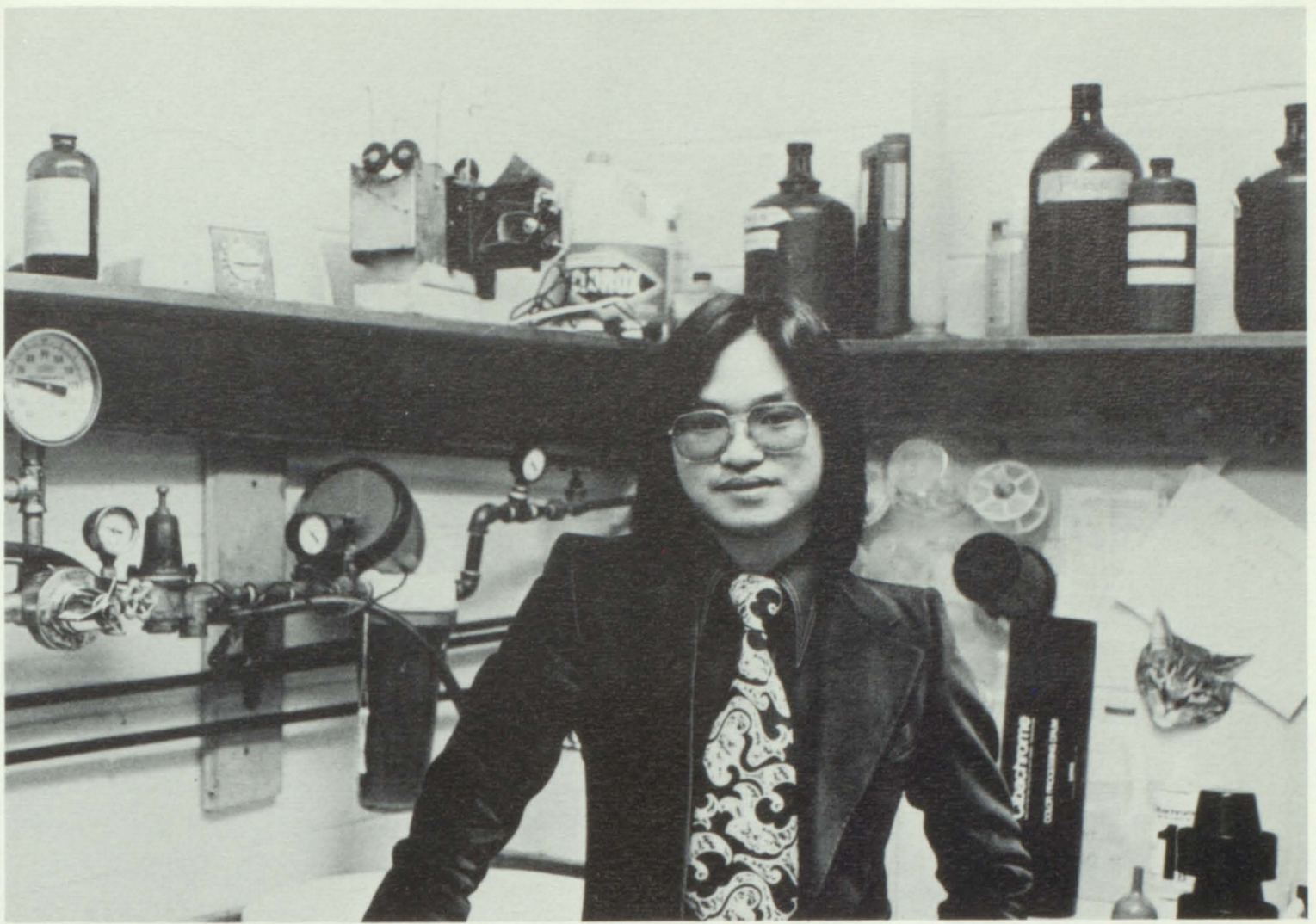
Moira-Jean Thompson brought to Hoosac both good fellowship and good judgement. She was well-liked for her friendliness and well-appreciated for her maturity.

Active in both soccer and hockey, Wong Wai-Ching was best known for his quiet, friendly manner and his excellent scholarship.

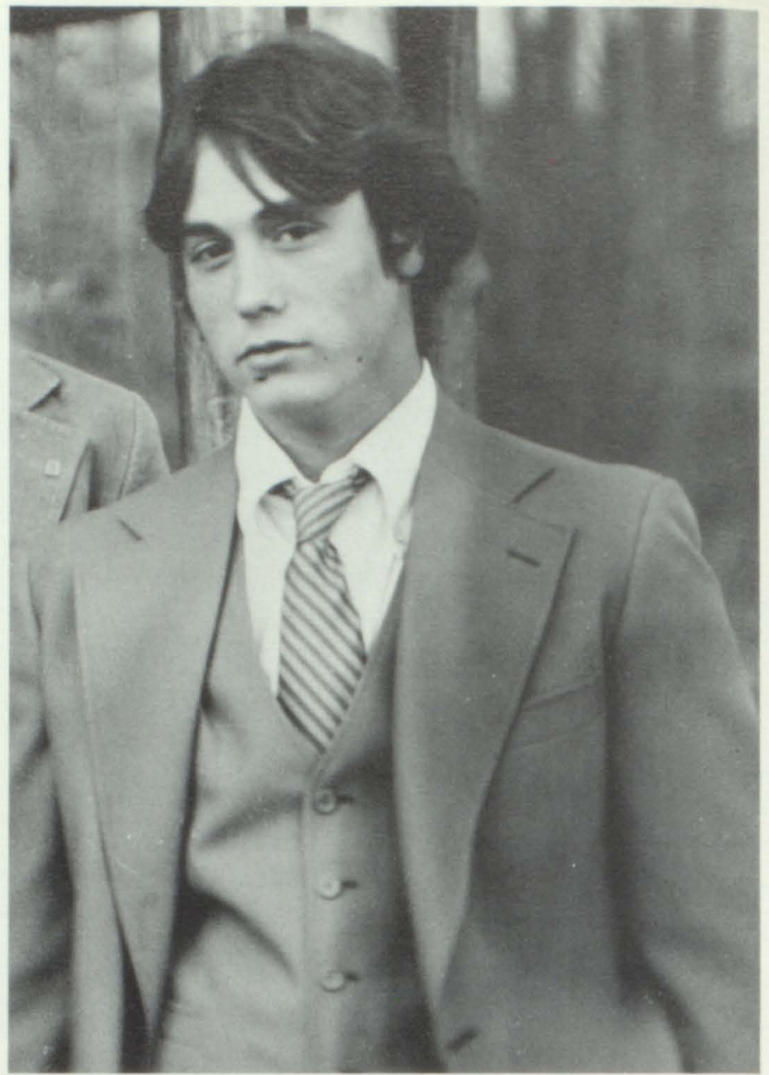


## Wong Wai-Kon

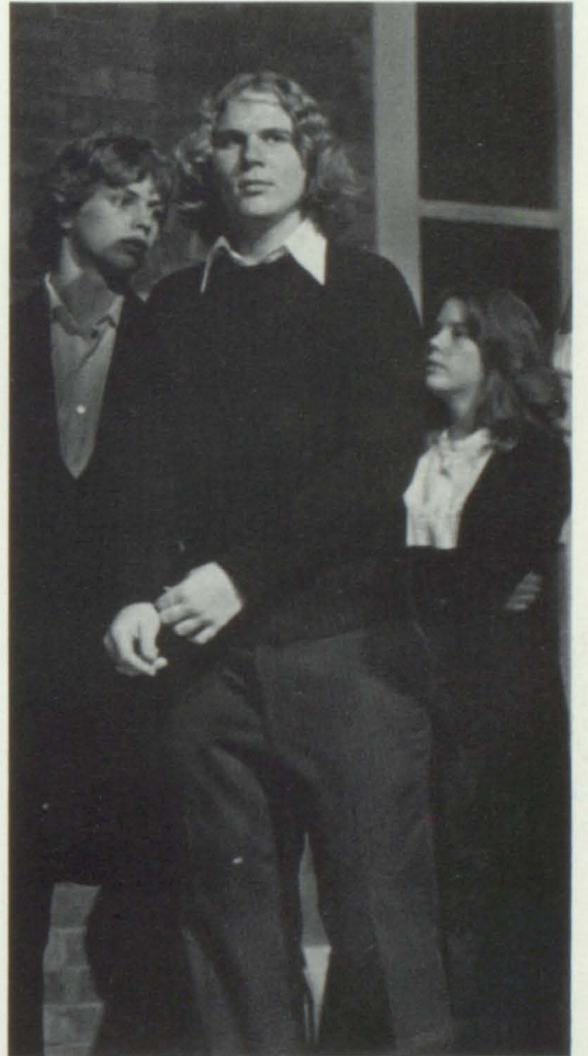
Mr. School Spirit, Chris Woods was involved in soccer, hockey, managing the Dining Hall, having a good time and just about everything else.

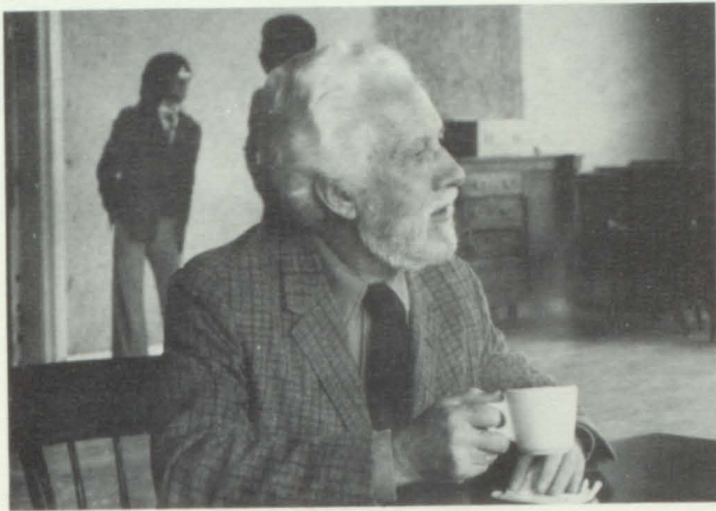

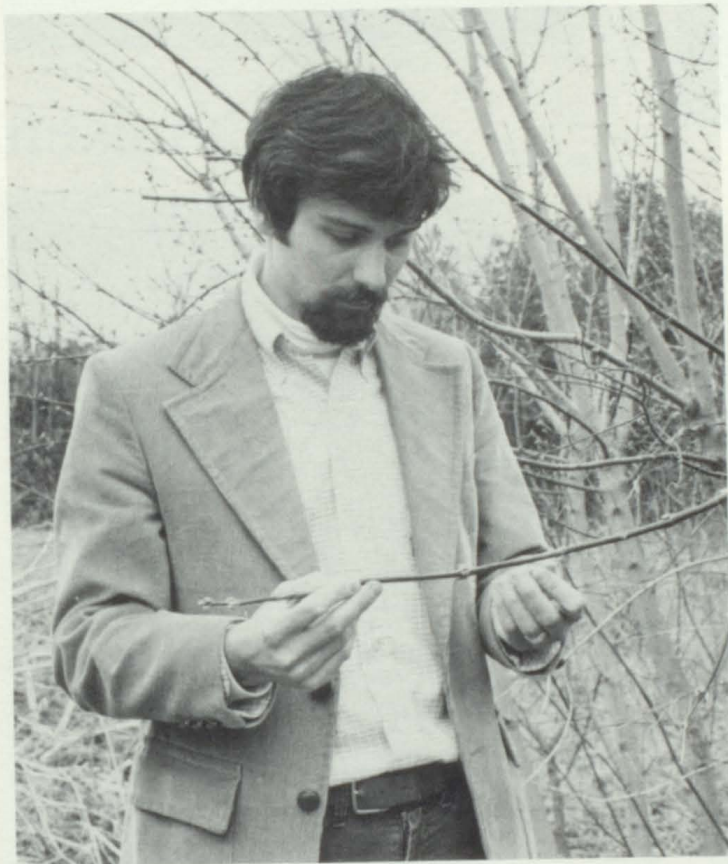


If life is full of surprises, French Teacher *Elizabeth Schulte* is probably ready for them.

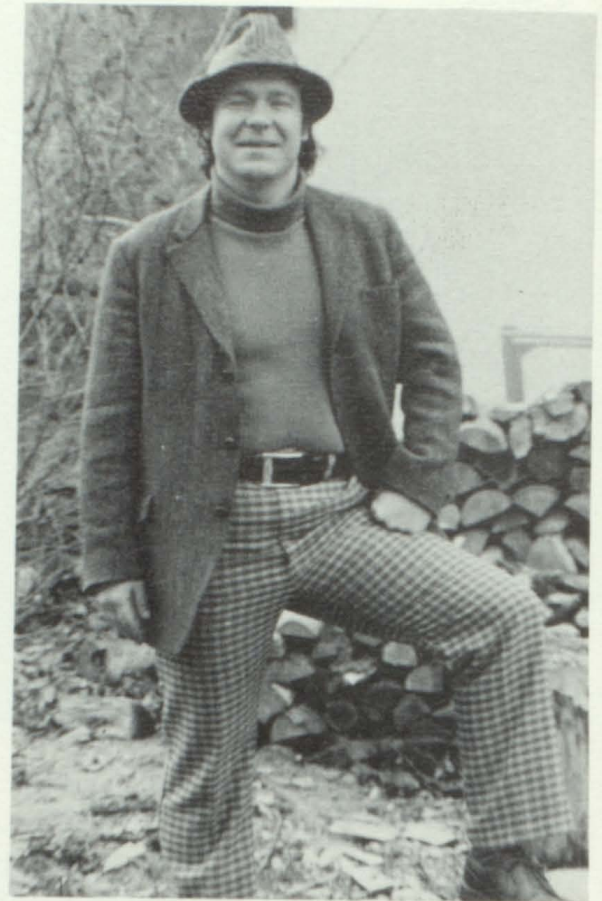


Frank Hebert

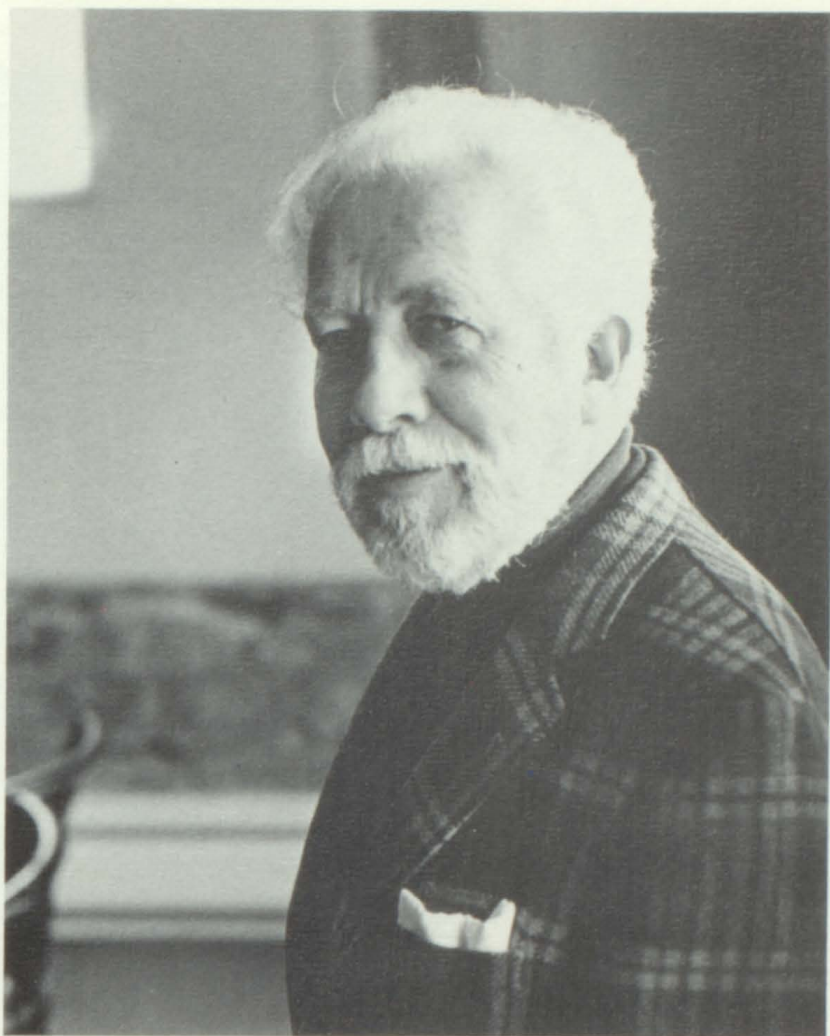

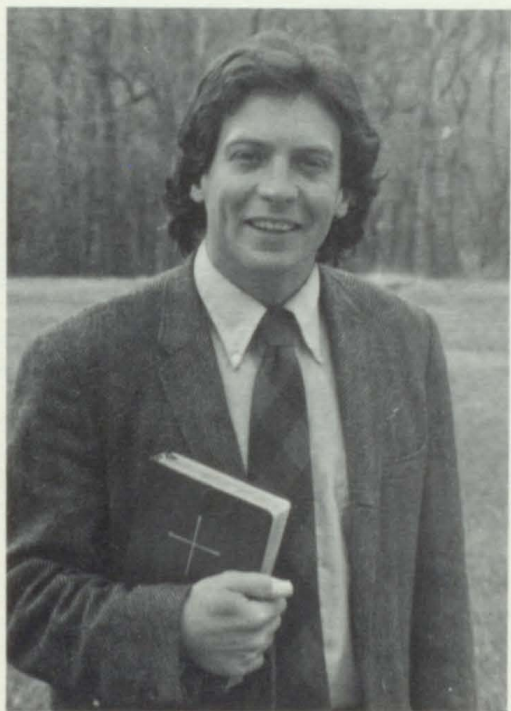
Dean of the faculty and personification of the Hoosac tradition, *John Gane* completed his last year at the school as librarian and mechanical drawing teacher.

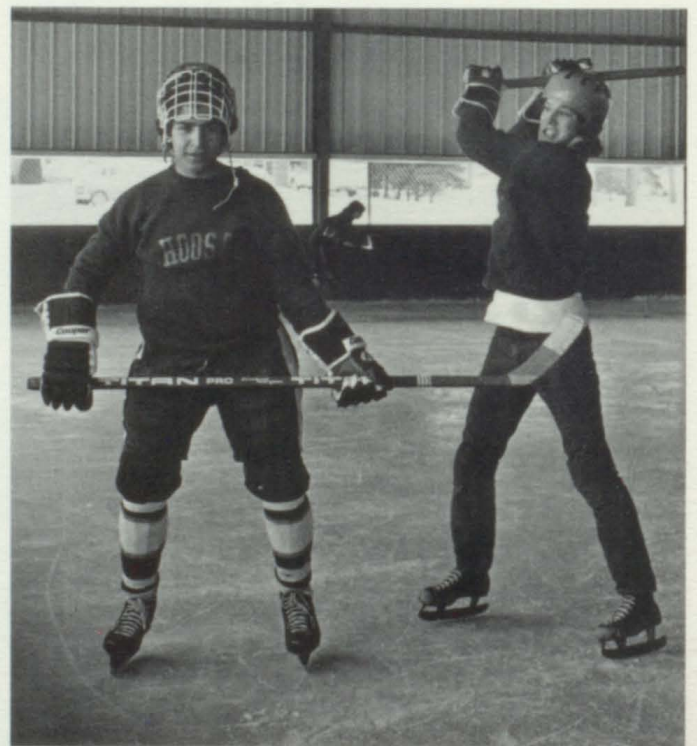
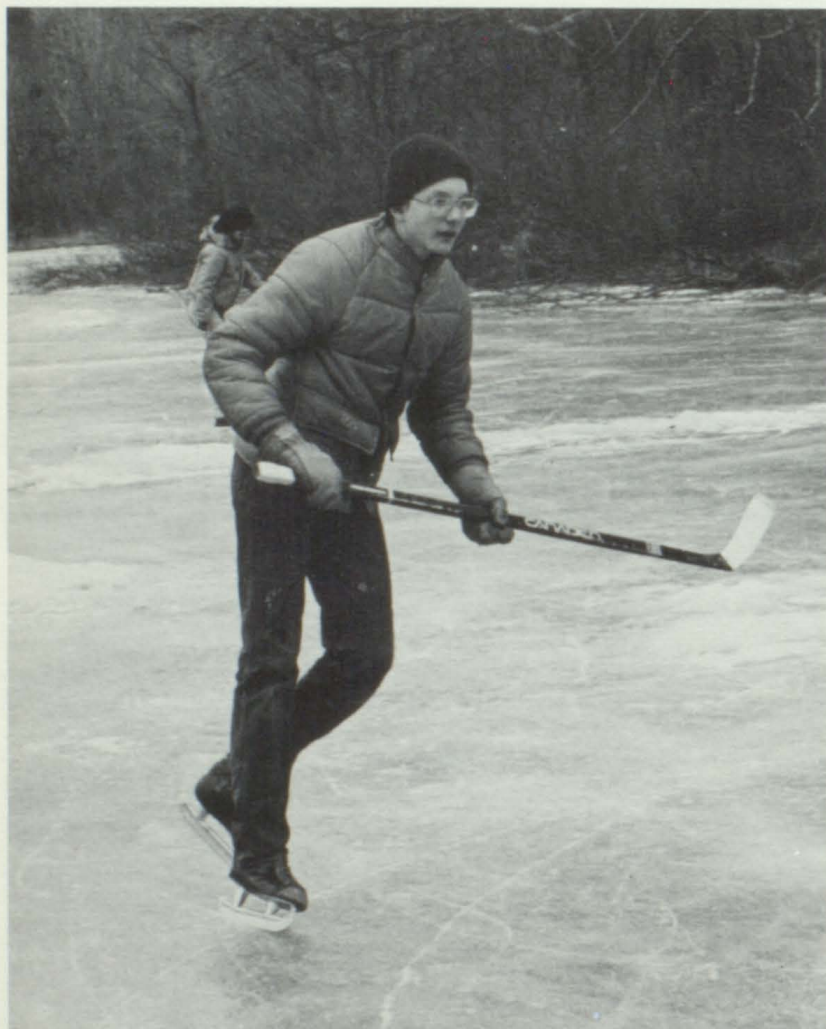
## 1979-1980 Soccer Team

The 1979-80 soccer team had a very successful year, both in terms of its won-lost record and individual game performances. The 10-6-1 season saw as some of its highlights a 2-1 victory over eventual N. Y. state Section II champion LaSalle Institute on Parents Weekend, and a heart-stopping, come from behind victory over Stevens School, the winning goal in the 2-1 game coming with just 35 seconds left in the game. The team went into Taconic Conference play-off action with an under-sized squad and took a 2-1 loss at the hands of Stevens.

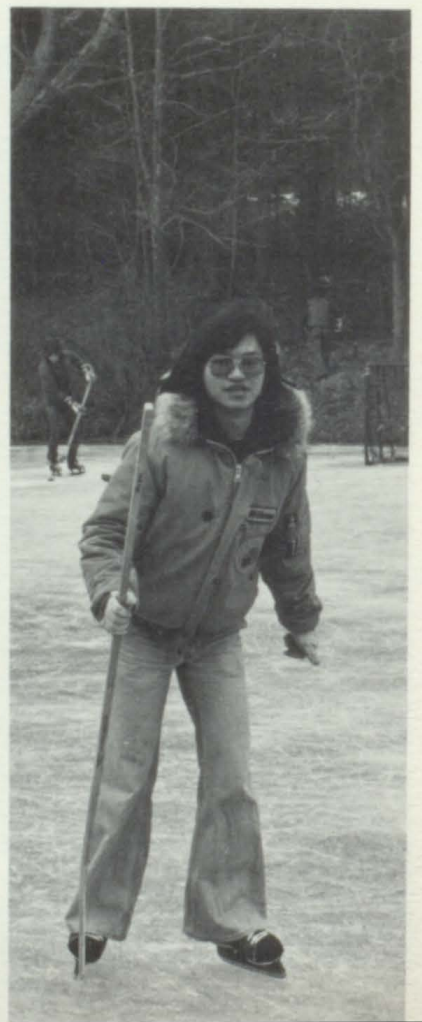

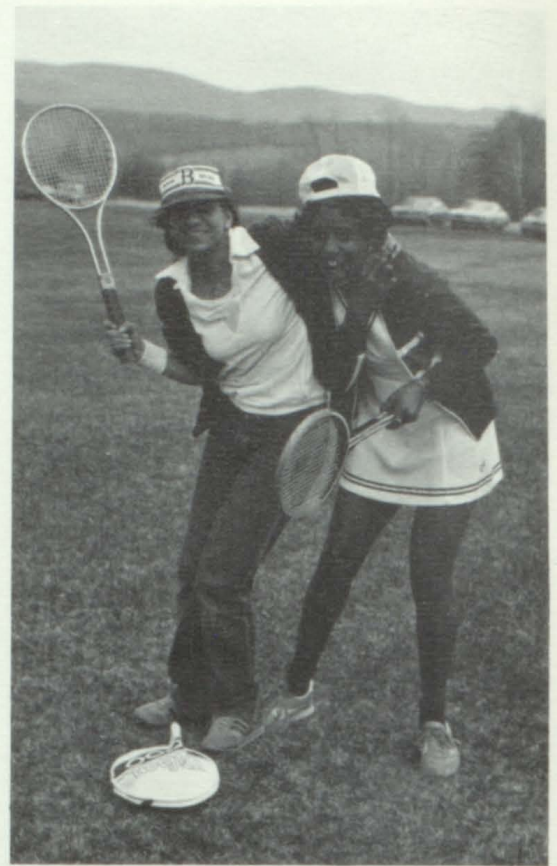

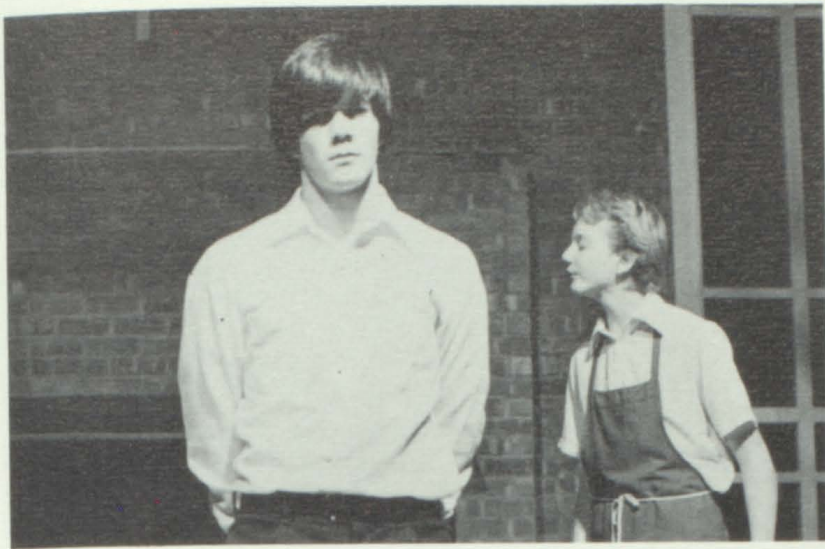
Townsend and Patrick Colliano. Also appearing in Drama Class productions were Lucretia Stone, Holly McGrath and Steve Montgomery.
