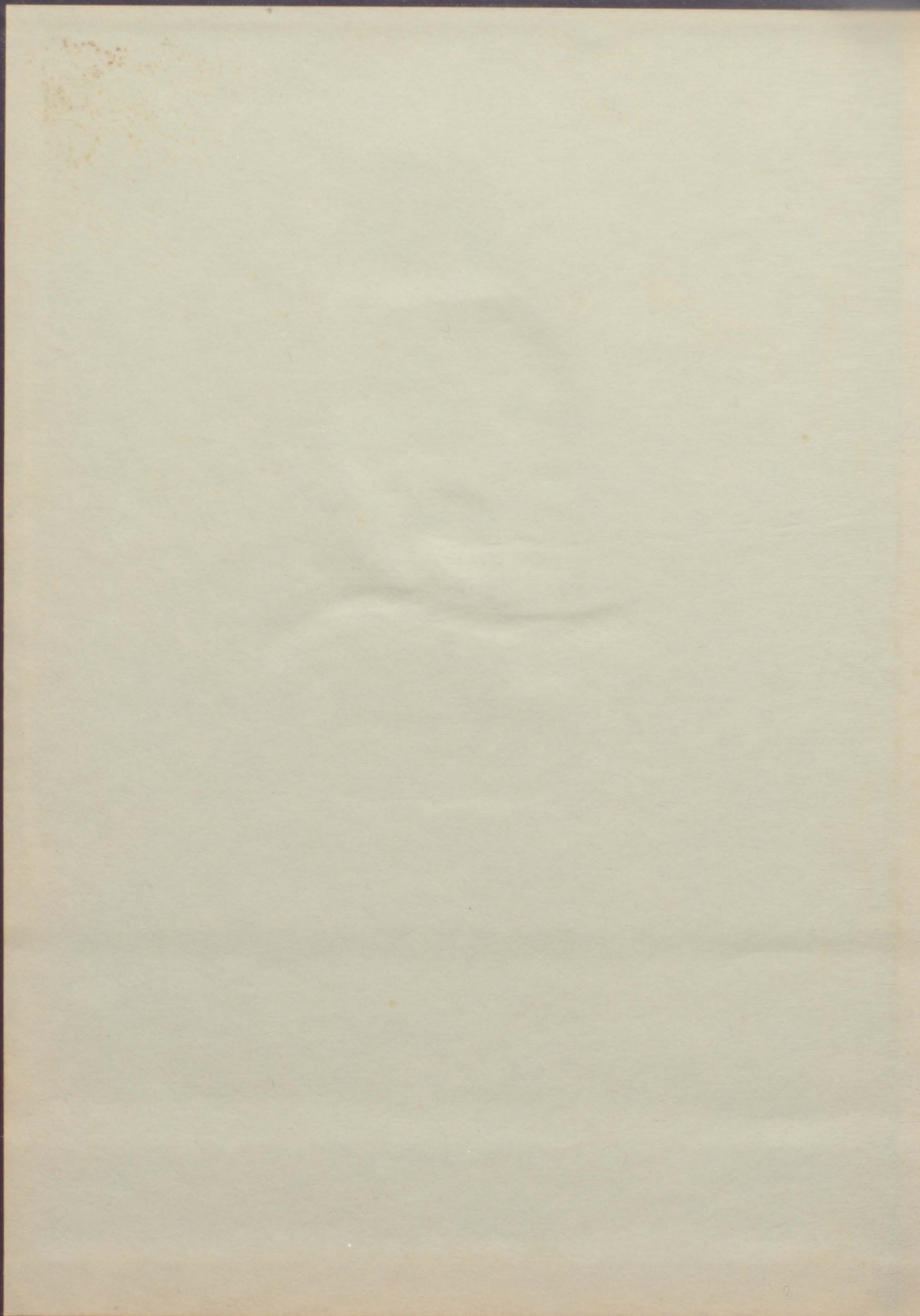
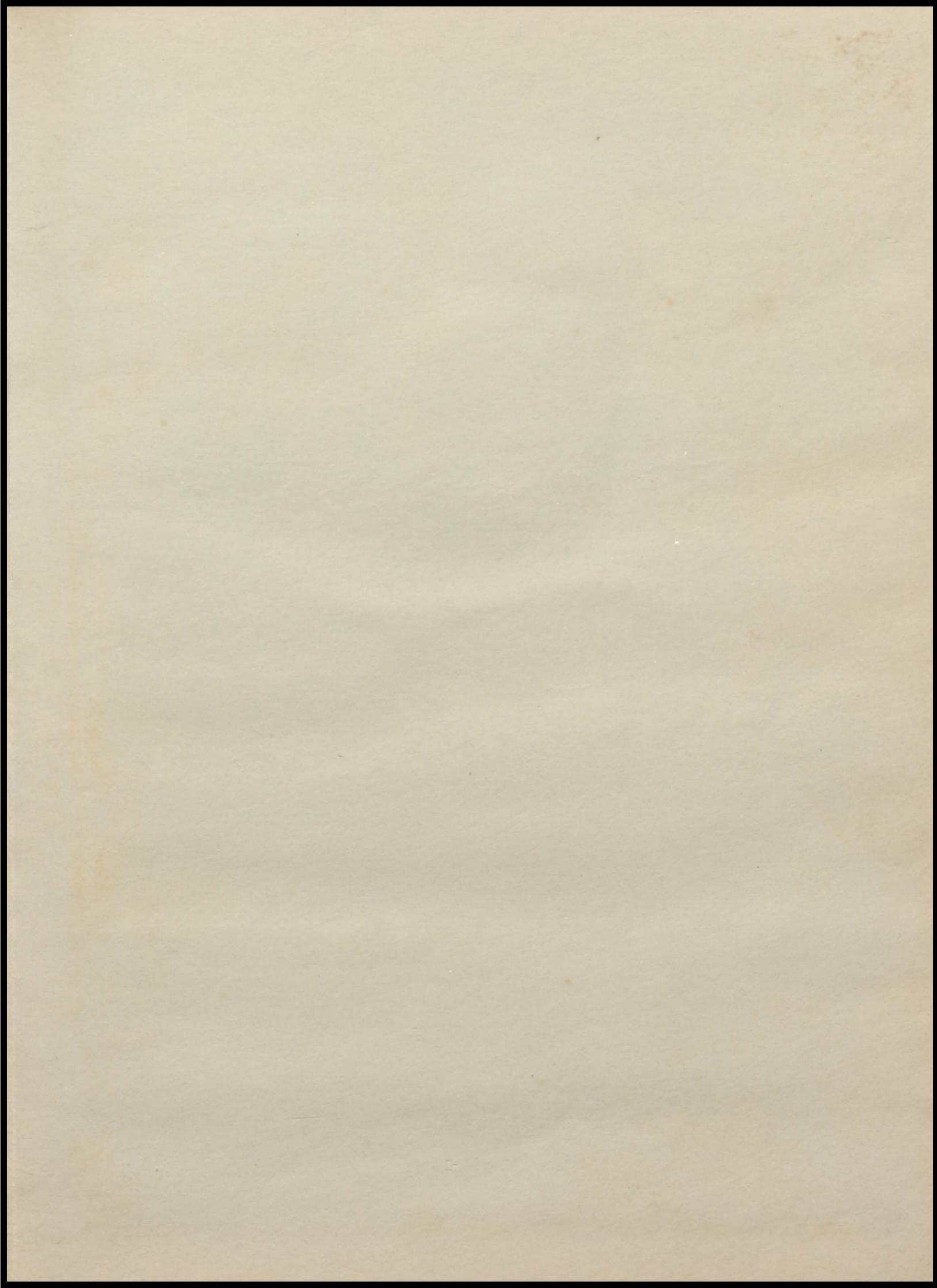


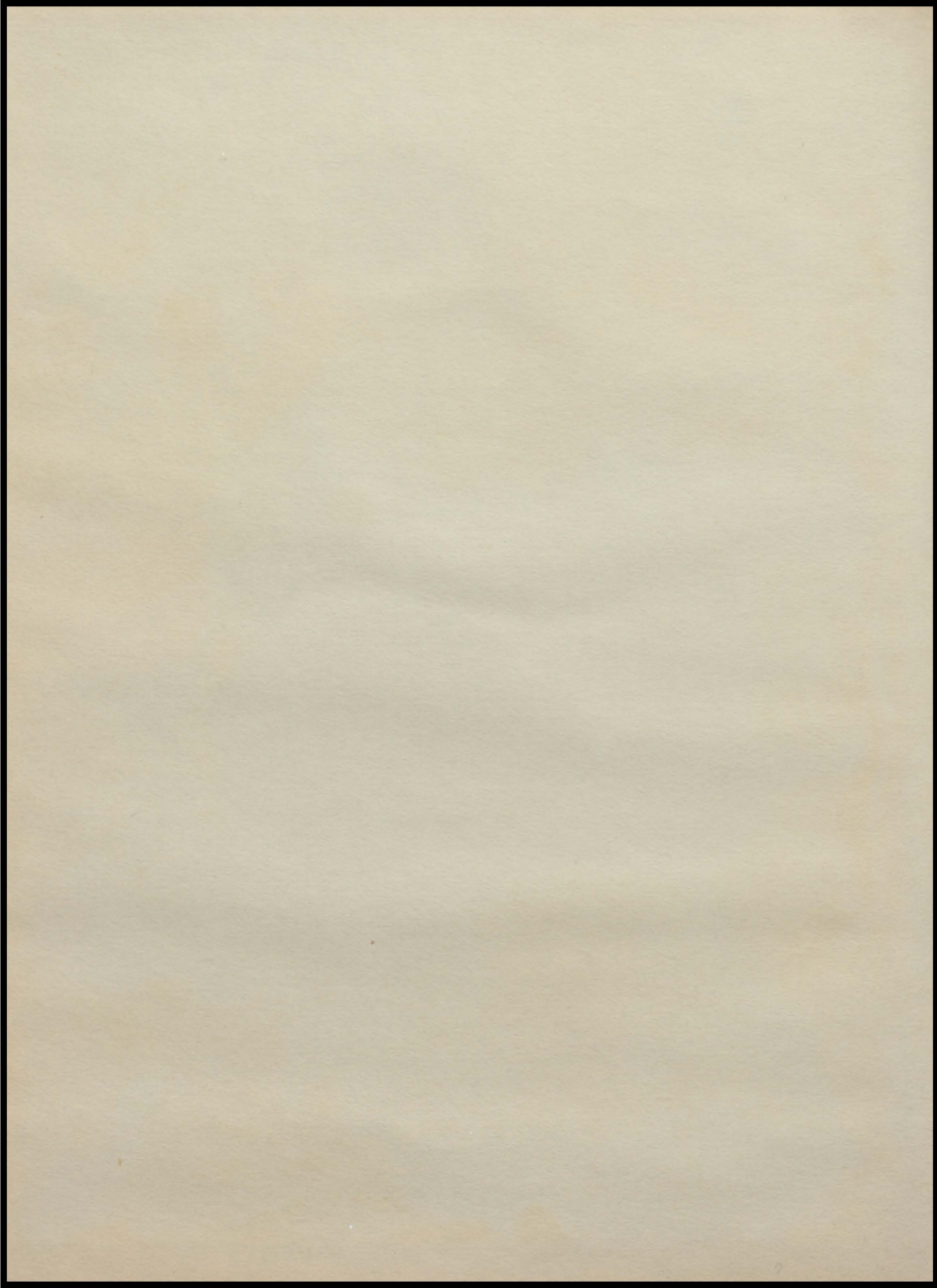

After Scarborough Fair


Mellowing breezes of soft summer wind

Made it, uncut by the thorns.

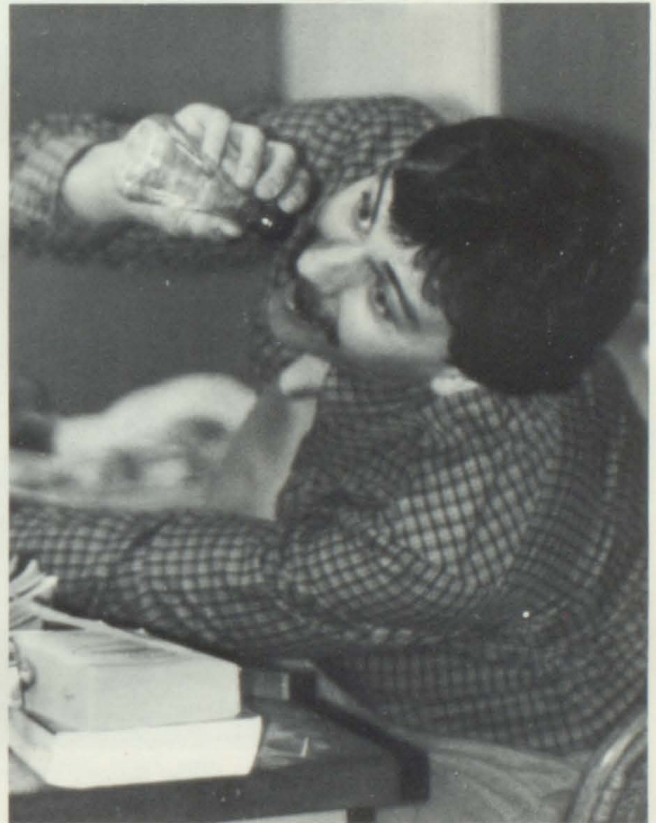
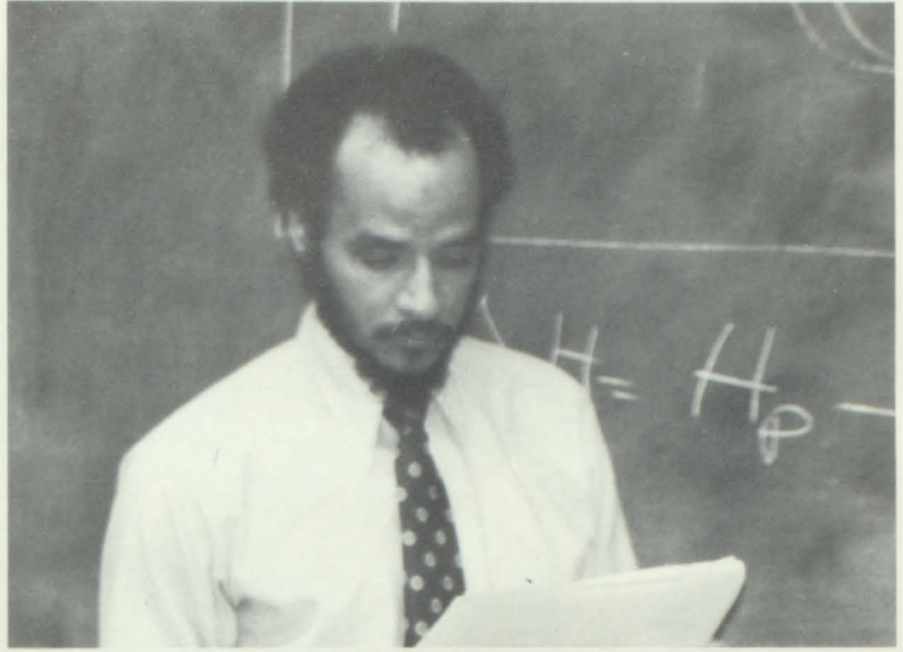
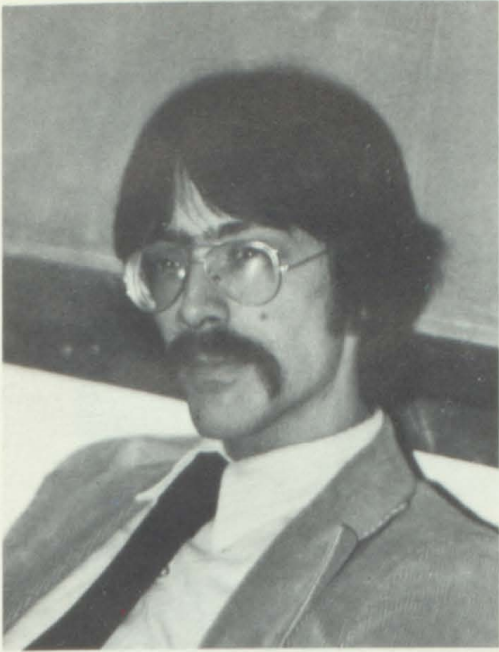
