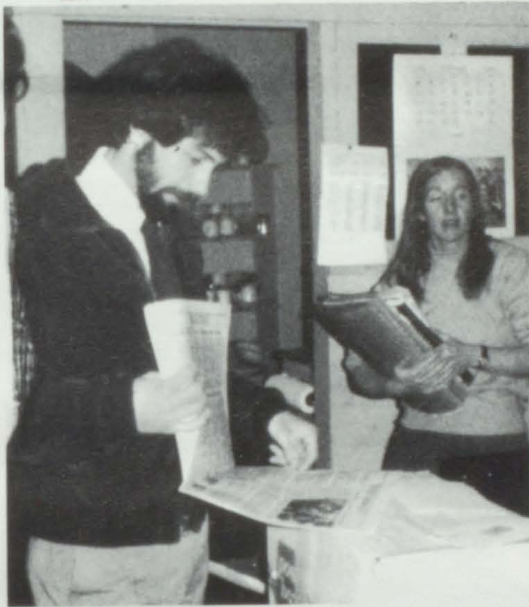


Dedication

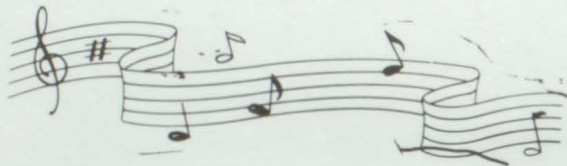






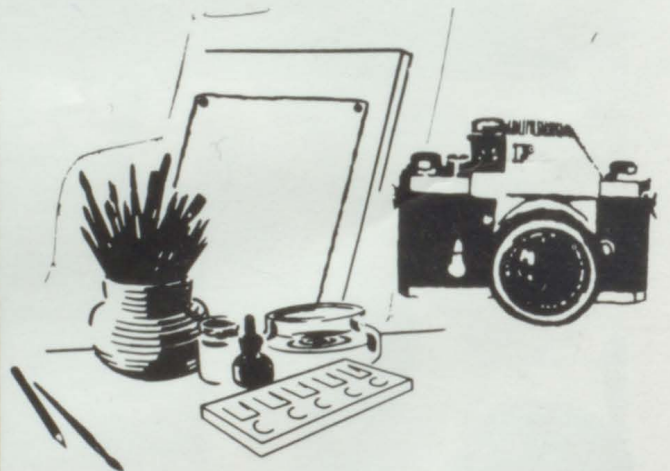
Music Club
