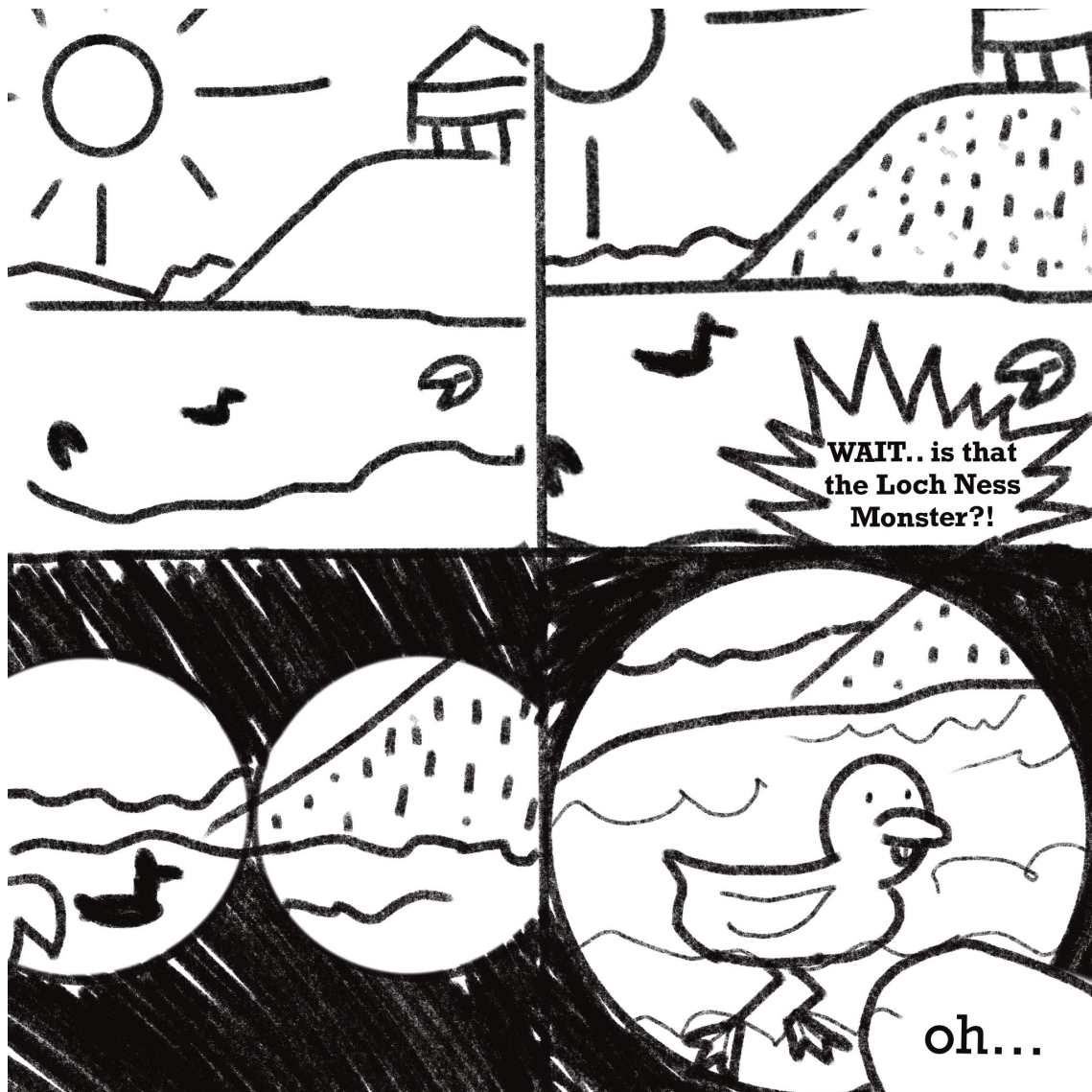
Basketball AAA

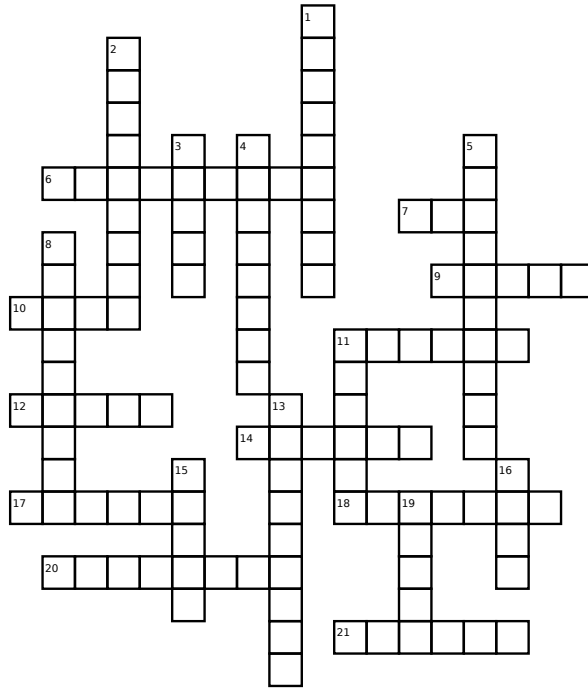
Volunteer work
